 - Staff On November 30th, Norma McClary in the Customer Service Department will retire with eleven years of service. A member of the Maintenance team is on leave of absence and a construction team member will be on baby-bonding leave beginning the first part of the new year. Temporary employment services personnel will assist the District until full-time appointments can be arranged.
 - LAFCo The voting process resulted in Director Benzonelli's appointment to the Alternate Special District seat and Troy Nicolini of the Peninsula CSD appointed to the Regular Special District seat.

- 2. Engineering Department
 - a) Status Report
 - Design Documents for Upcoming Projects Preliminary construction plans are in process for the Hartman Sewer Lift Station Reversal, Doctor Office Lane Sewer Line Replacement, and 18th Street Steel Main Replacement projects.
 - Tower Dr. Steel Main Replacement Project Update The full 580 ft. length of water main replacement is now installed. Once all testing processes are complete, services will be transferred to the new pipeline and the old water main removed from service.
- 3. a) October 2022 Construction Operations Report

Significant time was dedicated to the Tower Road Steel Water Main Line Replacement Project, in addition to leak repairs made to a service line on O'Neill, service line replacements on Lloyd and Campton, and a concrete water main line valve can installed on Park Street.

b) October 2022 Operations/Maintenance Report

In various locations throughout the District, filmed 3,336 ft. of sewer main line and cleaned 250 ft. of sewer main line. Preparations continue for upcoming Capital Improvement Projects. For the year 2022, the 457 Supplemental Retirement Plan contribution is \$580.

Summary:

The Governor's Executive Order N-08-21 provided modification to the Brown Act authorizing public teleconference meetings during the COVID-19 Emergency without the requirement of personal appearance. On September 16, 2021, Governor Newsom signed Assembly Bills (AB) 339 and 361 into law which was followed by Executive Order N-15-21 on September 20, 2021 stipulating the sunset of Executive Order N-08-21 as of September 30, 2021.

As presented at the October 12, 2021 regular meeting, and subsequently at each first meeting of the month, provisions of AB 361 officially modify the Brown Act to enable public agencies to move immediately to relaxed teleconference meetings under a declared state of emergency. Each month the March 20, 2020 state of emergency remains in effect, the Board is required to pass a resolution every thirty (30) days until lifted, affirming the following:

- 1. The Board has considered the circumstances of the state of emergency
- 2. Any of the following circumstances exist:
 - a. The state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members to meet safely in person.
 - b. State or local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing.

Resolution 2022-19 before you, affirms the foregoing conditions allowing the District to proceed with virtual meetings for the next thirty (30) days while the current state of emergency remains in effect and/or the County's recommendations for social distancing remain in effect. In addition to the many restrictions that have been lifted, the Governor's office advised the existing state of emergency is scheduled to sunset February 28, 2023

RESOLUTION NO. 2022-19

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE HUMBOLDT COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT MAKING FINDINGS PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 54953, AS AMENDED BY ASSEMBLY BILL 361, AND AUTHORIZING THE CONTINUED USE OF VIRTUAL MEETINGS

WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Governor issued Executive Order Nos. N-08-21, N-25-20 and N-29-20, which suspended certain provisions of the Ralph M. Brown Act to allow legislative bodies to conduct public meetings without strict compliance with the teleconferencing provisions of the Brown Act;

WHEREAS, Assembly Bill 361, which was signed into law on September 20, 2021, amended Government Code section 54953, to provide relief from the teleconferencing provisions of the Brown Act under certain circumstances provided the legislative body makes certain findings;

WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Governor proclaimed a state of emergency on March 4, 2020, in accordance with the section 8625 of the California Emergency Services Act, and the state of emergency remains in effect;

WHEREAS, as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic, the Humboldt County Health Officer has imposed and has recommended measures to promote social distancing as more particularly set forth in his August 6, 2021, Order, among other prior orders and guidance;

NOW, THEREFORE, the Board of Directors does hereby find and resolve as follows: 1. That the Board has reconsidered the circumstances of the previously declared and existing state of emergency arising from the COVID-19 pandemic;

2. That the state of emergency continues to directly impact the ability of the members of the Board to meet safely in person, and further that local officials continue to impose or recommend measures to promote social distancing;

3. That the Board may continue to conduct public meetings in accordance with Government Code section 54953(e);

4. That the Board will reconsider the above findings within 30-days of this Resolution.

Rate Study

We continue to make progress on the District's rate study. Staff have worked diligently with the consultant to develop rate models for water and sewer rates and connection fees. These complex models take into account historical and projected spending and enable the user to see the effects of various decisions regarding rate setting on the District's finances and financial health. We anticipate being able to present a first draft of the District's Rate Study Report in January or February for the Boards review. Once the Board has approved the Draft Report, we will be able to begin the Proposition 218 process.

The biggest delay to the District's rate study process has been the City of Eureka. Our rate study relies on information from the City. The City experienced delays and uncertainty regarding projected capital expenditures. This in turn caused delays in their overall process. The District and our mutual consultant determined that waiting for the City to finalize their projections before proceeding with the District's rate study so as to have the best available information. Once the City did finalize their projections (slightly more than a month ago), those relevant to the District were made available to District staff for inclusion in the District's rate study.

Many of the projections that the City was struggling to finalize ultimately came from District staff's projections. Other projections that were made by the City were questionable. When the consultant questioned City staff about those projections, City staff ultimately indicated that the District's projections were better than their own. Unless the relationship between the City of Eureka and the District is significantly improved over the next five years, I recommend not tying the District's rate setting process to the City's going forward.

At the outset of the rate study solicitation, the expectation was that the study would be completed during the summer months, the Proposition 218 process would occur in the fall and the new rates would take effect in January of 2023. Considering the significant delays to the process and the complications associated with mid-fiscal year adjustments to rates and fees, the new rates will take effect July 1, 2023 barring any unforeseen obstacles.

ACWA/JPIA

Each year at the Fall Conference, the JPIA recognizes member agencies that have a loss ratio of 20% or less. This year the District received three "President's Special Recognition Awards," one for our Liability policy, one for our Property policy, and one for our Workers Compensation policy. Sewer Pretreatment Facility Inspections

The District maintains a pre-treatment program to reduce Fats, Oils, & Grease (FOG) in the wastewater collection system and at the wastewater treatment facility. This is an update of the District's activities regarding the District's pre-treatment program.

A major source of FOG is animal and vegetable-based oil and grease from restaurants and food processing establishments. Traps and interceptors require regular maintenance to remain effective at removing FOG from wastewater. Maintenance intervals vary for each device based on the size of the interceptor or trap, the volume of wastewater and the type of wastewater created. FOG that gets into the collection system can cause blockages, possibly resulting in Sanitary Sewer Overflows (SSOs). High FOG levels at the wastewater treatment plant, can inhibit biological processes and cause equipment blockages.

The pre-treatment program involves biannual inspection of approximately 45 grease traps and interceptors and their respective maintenance and cleaning schedules, a public education program regarding Best Management Practices (BMPs), and a review of all building permit applications.

Engineering staff have inspected twelve devices this year, and will inspect approximately twelve more before the year end. Inspections include opening the device for a visual inspection with the device operators, and reviewing their cleaning log and maintenance plan. For larger devices staff also review vendor pumping and cleaning receipts.

Humboldt County Pine Hill Road Bridge Project

The County of Humboldt is preparing to replace the Pine Hill Bridge that crosses Swain Slough. District Engineering staff worked with Humboldt County's Engineering department to ensure the proposed replacement bridge has sufficient capacity to support a future 12" water main, if required in an emergency situation.

The current bridge supports a 12" water main which connects the Humboldt Hill and Pine Hill water distribution zones. The District installed a 16" water main under Swain HCSD Board of Directors Regular Meeting of December 13, 2022 Engineering Dept. Status Report Page **2** of **2**

Slough in preparation for the County's bridge replacement project. This new water main maintains the hydraulic connection between the distribution zones while allowing the bridge project to proceed.

Tower Dr. Steel Main Replacement Project Update

District forces have finished installing approximately 575 feet of new water main and a fire hydrant in Tower Dr. All existing water services have been transferred to the new main from the old steel water main. The steel main has been disconnected and abandoned in place. As of this writing there are 2 new water services remaining to be installed, and final paving to complete the project.

Summary:

In accordance with Government Code §61043, within 45 days after each general district or unopposed election, the Board must select from among its membership, officers and representatives. Traditionally the appointments have been for the subsequent two years.

The Board's current appointment of officers and committee members expire, December 13, 2022. The roles to fill are:

President: Chairs meetings, signs on behalf of Board/District when required. Strong familiarity with the Brown Act, Robert's Rules of Order, and parliamentary procedure helpful.

Vice President: Serves in the President's capacity during an absence

Employee Relations Officer: Fulfills duties contained in the Personnel Policies & Procedures as needed.

Two (2) Audit Committee Members: Meets at least once per year with the Finance Manager and General Manager to review fiscal year draft audit reports, clarify questions, and presents recommendation for approval or changes to the Board during open session of a regular meeting.

RREDC Representative & Alternate: A monthly commitment held the fourth Monday of most months at 6:30 p.m. Established in 1977 under a Joint Exercise of Power Agreement for the purposes of applying, accepting, administering grants, financial assistance from Federal Government, State Government, or any other source for economic development

projects. Each Member appoints a Director and Alternate to the RREDC Board. HCSD is an original member.

ACWA/JPIA Director & Alternate: Generally, two out of the area meetings annually. The JPIA is member-owned, member-governed and member driven. The District has been a member since the mid-1990's. The organization is governed by the Board of Directors, which is composed of one representative from each member agency. As with the HCSD, the appointed directors are responsible for setting policy for the management of the Liability, Property, Workers' Compensation, and Employee Health Benefits insurance programs. The representative director must be a member of his/her governing board and be selected by that board for the JPIA Board.

Recommendation:

Staff recommends that the Board of Directors approve the attached amendment to the On-Call Engineering Services Contract

Summary:

The District is currently engaged in separate On-Call Engineering Services Contracts with SHN and GHD. Those contracts are scheduled to expire on January 1, 2023. The Request for Qualifications (RFQ) and the agreement itself were intentionally developed to provide a vehicle by which we can access grant writing assistance from local municipal grant writing experts. GHD in particular, and to a lesser extent SHN have been successful writing for infrastructure grants for local municipalities.

Their model is to assist with the grant writing process to help secure funding for a municipality for infrastructure work that needs to be done. Once the project is funded, they bid on the design work and other project aspects like construction management and grant administration for which they secured funding. In the past, they did this work under individual contracts separated by task. For example, grant writing assistance would be contracted separately from design and bidding assistance which would be contracted separately from design and bidding assistance which would be contracted separately from construction management.

Of the state and federal money available, most of the larger local municipalities including HBMWD, McCSD and HCSD are only eligible for FEMA Hazard Mitigation funds to perform infrastructure improvements. Unfortunately, FEMA and CalOES (the state agency responsible for administering FEMA grants) have determined that if an organization or engineering firm helped to develop the grant application, they would be ineligible to bid on the design or construction management phases of the project if they are contracted separately. This RFQ and agreement were written with the intention of following FEMA's procurement policies so that if a firm assisted with the grant writing they would still be eligible to perform the design and/or construction management tasks.

Through discussions with CalOES over the past several months, and review of our On-Call Engineering Services Agreement, some deficiencies were identified per FEMA's Regular HCSD Board Meeting of December 13, 2022 Report Page 2 of 2 Agenda Item H.3

contracting policies. The deficient language is included in the draft amendment included in this Board Packet.

One of the reasons that CalOES was reviewing our On-Call Engineering Services RFQ and On-Call Engineering Services Agreement is that we have an active Hazard Mitigation Grant that requires design work to be finalized and I wanted to ensure that the District was following proper procurement procedure under the FEMA grant. That conversation has been ongoing since July and as of December 4, I finally have approval to proceed using our On-Call Services Contract given the amended language.

One problem. The existing contract is set to expire on January 1, 2023 and I don't have time to solicit for On-Call Engineers before that date. My solution is to extend the existing contracts through March 1, 2023 using this amendment so that we can get to work on finalizing the designs for the project and potentially bid some of the construction work for next summer/fall. In the meantime, I will solicit for Statements of Qualifications and award contracts before the amended March 1, 2023 expiration date.

FIRST AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH (Consultant Name)

THIS FIRST AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICES AGREEMENT WITH (Consultant Name) ("Amendment") is entered into and effective as of December 16, 2022 ("Effective Date"), by and between the Humboldt Community Services District, a subdivision of the State of California ("District"), and (Consultant Name), a California corporation ("Consultant") (individually, each a "Party" and collectively, the "Parties").

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Parties entered into that written Humboldt Community Services District Professional Services Agreement with (Consultant Name) as of (Original Effective Date) (the "Agreement"), through which Consultant agreed to provide certain professional engineering services to the District. Capitalized terms not expressly defined herein shall have the meaning ascribed to them in the Agreement.

WHEREAS, the Parties enter into this Amendment for the purpose of amending the Agreement to provide additional terms and conditions, as set forth below.

THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual covenants contained in this Amendment and for valuable consideration, the Parties agree as follows:

1. Extension of the Term. Notwithstanding anything in the Agreement to the contrary, Section 3 of the Agreement is amended so that the term of the Agreement is extended to and will expire at 11:59 PM on March 1, 2023.

2. Addition of Exhibit B. The Agreement shall be amended to append as "Exhibit B" the exhibit attached to this Amendment as "Exhibit B". In all respects, Exhibit B hereto shall be incorporated by reference into the Agreement from and after the effective date of this Amendment.

3. No Further Modification; Conflict. Except as set forth in this Amendment, all of the terms and provisions of the Agreement shall remain unmodified and in full force and effect. In the event of any conflict between the terms, covenants and conditions of the Agreement, and the terms, covenants and conditions of this Amendment, the terms, covenants and conditions of this Amendment shall govern and control.

4. **Counterparts; Signatures.** This Amendment may be signed in two or more counterparts. When at least one such counterpart has been signed by each party, this Amendment shall be deemed to have been fully executed, each counterpart shall be deemed to be an original, and all counterparts shall be deemed to be one and the same agreement. This Amendment may be executed by a party's signature transmitted by facsimile or by electronic means, and copies of Amendment executed and delivered by means of faxed or electronic signatures shall have the same force and effect as copies hereof executed and delivered with original signatures. All parties hereto may rely upon faxed or electronic signatures as if such signatures were originals. All parties hereto agree that a faxed or electronic signature page may be introduced into evidence in any proceeding arising out of or related to this Amendment as if it were an original signature page.

EXHIBIT B

Additional Contract Provisions

The following provisions are incorporated by reference into the Agreement:

Equal Employment

The regulation at 41 C.F.R. § 60-1.4(b) requires, except as otherwise provided or exempted in 41 C.F.R. Part 60, the insertion of the following contract clause: "During the performance of this contract, the consultant agrees as follows:

1) The consultant will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The consultant will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following:

Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The consultant agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.

- 2) The consultant will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the consultant, state that all qualified applicants will receive consideration for employment without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.
- 3) The consultant will not discharge or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the consultant's legal duty to furnish information.
- 4) The consultant will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the consultant's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- 5) The consultant will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- 6) The consultant will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency

and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.

- 7) In the event of the consultant's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the consultant may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- 8) The consultant will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (1) and the provisions of paragraphs (1) through (8) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subconsultant or vendor. The consultant will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance:

Provided, however, that in the event a consultant becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subconsultant or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency, the consultant may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

The applicant further agrees that it will be bound by the above equal opportunity clause with respect to its own employment practices when it participates in federally assisted construction work: Provided, that if the applicant so participating is a state or local government, the above equal opportunity clause is not applicable to any agency, instrumentality or subdivision of such government which does not participate in work on or under the contract.

The applicant agrees that it will assist and cooperate actively with the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor in obtaining the compliance of consultants and subconsultants with the equal opportunity clause and the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor, that it will furnish the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor such information as they may require for the supervision of such compliance, and that it will otherwise assist the administering agency in the discharge of the agency's primary responsibility for securing compliance.

The applicant further agrees that it will refrain from entering into any contract or contract modification subject to Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, with a consultant debarred from, or who has not demonstrated eligibility for, Government contracts and federally assisted construction contracts pursuant to the Executive Order and will carry out such sanctions and penalties for violation of the equal opportunity clause as may be imposed upon consultants and subconsultants by the administering agency or the Secretary of Labor pursuant to Part II, Subpart D of the Executive Order. In addition, the applicant agrees that if it fails or refuses to comply with these undertakings, the administering agency may take any or all of the following actions: Cancel,

terminate, or suspend in whole or in part this grant (contract, loan, insurance, guarantee); refrain from extending any further assistance to the applicant under the program with respect to which the failure or refund occurred until satisfactory assurance of future compliance has been received from such applicant; and refer the case to the Department of Justice for appropriate legal proceedings.

Davis-Bacon Act

The Davis-Bacon Act only applies to the Emergency Management Performance Grant Program, Homeland Security Grant Program, Nonprofit Security Grant Program, Tribal Homeland Security Grant Program, Port Security Grant Program, Transit Security Grant Program, Intercity Passenger Rail Program, and Rehabilitation of High Hazard Potential Dams Program. Unless otherwise stated in a program's authorizing statute, it does not apply to other FEMA grant and cooperative agreement programs, including the PA Program.

When applicable per the above paragraph, the District must include the provisions at 29 C.F.R. § 5.5(a)(1)-(10) in full into all prime construction contracts over \$2,000, and all applicable contractors/consultants must include these provisions in full in any subcontracts 29 C.F.R. § 5.5(a)(1), (6).

The provisions of 29 C.F.R. § 5.5(a)(1)-(10) are incorporated in full into this agreement by reference.

Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act

Compliance with the Copeland "Anti-Kickback" Act.

Contractor/Consultant. The contractor/consultant shall comply with 18 U.S.C. § 874,40 U.S.C. § 3145, and the requirements of 29 C.F.R. Part 3 as may be applicable, which are incorporated by reference into this agreement.

Subcontracts. The contractor/consultant or subcontractor shall insert in any subcontracts the clause above and such other clauses as FEMA may by appropriate instructions require, and also a clause requiring the subcontractors to include these clauses in any lower tier subcontracts. The prime contractor/consultant shall be responsible for the compliance by any subcontractor or lower tier subcontractor with all of these contract clauses.

Breach. A breach of the contract clauses above may be grounds for termination of the contract, and for debarment as a contractor/consultant and subcontractor as provided in 29 C.F.R. § 5.12.

Suspension and Debarment

- a) This agreement is a covered transaction for purposes of 2 C.F.R. Part 180 and 2 C.F.R. Part 3000. As such, the Consultant is required to verify that none of the Consultant's principals (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.995) or its affiliates (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.905) are excluded (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.940) or disqualified (defined at 2 C.F.R. § 180.935).
- b) The Consultant must comply with 2 C.F.R. Part 180, subpart C and 2C.F.R. Part 3000, subpart C, and must include a requirement to comply with these regulations in any lower tier covered transaction it enters into.
- c) This certification is a material representation of fact relied upon by the District. If it is later determined that the Consultant did not comply with 2 C.F.R. Part 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. Part

3000, subpart C, in addition to remedies available to the District, the federal government may pursue available remedies, including but not limited to suspension and/or debarment.

d) The Consultant agrees to comply with the requirements of 2 C.F.R. Part 180, subpart C and 2 C.F.R. Part 3000, subpart C while this offer is valid and throughout the period of any agreement that may arise from this offer. The Consultant further agrees to include a provision requiring such compliance in its lower tier covered transactions.

Byrd Anti-Lobbying Amendment, 31 U.S.C. § 1352 (as amended)

Consultants who apply or bid for an award of more than \$100,000 shall file the required certification in the form attached hereto as **Attachment 1**. Each tier certifies to the tier above that it will not and has not used federally appropriated funds to pay any person or organization for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, officer or employee of Congress in connection with obtaining any federal contract, grant, or any other award covered by 31 U.S.C. § 1352. Each tier shall also disclose any lobbying with non-federal funds that takes place in connection with obtaining any federal award. Such disclosures are forwarded from tier to tier up to the recipient who in turn will forward the certification(s) to the federal awarding agency.

Clean Air Act

The Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders or regulations issued pursuant to the Clean Air Act, as amended, 42 U.S.C. § 7401 et seq. The Consultant agrees to report each violation to the District and understands and agrees that the District will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office. The Consultant agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with federal assistance provided by FEMA.

Federal Water Pollution Control Act

The Consultant agrees to comply with all applicable standards, orders, or regulations issued pursuant to the federal Water Pollution Control Act, as amended, 33 U.S.C. § 1251 et seq. The Consultant agrees to report each violation to the District and understands and agrees that the District will, in turn, report each violation as required to assure notification to the California Office of Emergency Services, Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA), and the appropriate Environmental Protection Agency Regional Office. The consultant agrees to include these requirements in each subcontract exceeding \$150,000 financed in whole or in part with federal assistance provided by FEMA.

Access to Records

The following access to records requirements apply to this Agreement:

- a) The Consultant agrees to provide CalOES, District, the FEMA Administrator, the Comptroller General of the United States, or any of their authorized representatives access to any books, documents, papers, and records of the Consultant which are directly pertinent to this contract for the purposes of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions.
- b) The Consultant agrees to permit any of the foregoing parties to reproduce by any means whatsoever or to copy excerpts and transcriptions as reasonably needed.

- c) The Consultant agrees to provide the FEMA Administrator or his authorized representatives access to construction or other work sites pertaining to the work being completed under the contract.
- d) In compliance with the Disaster Recovery Act of 2018, the District and the Consultant acknowledge and agree that no language in this contract is intended to prohibit audits or internal reviews by the FEMA Administrator or the Comptroller General of the United States.

FEMA Funded Project; No Obligation

This is an acknowledgement that FEMA financial assistance will be used to fund all or a portion of the Services. The Consultant will comply with all applicable Federal law, regulations, executive orders, FEMA policies, procedures, and directives.

The Federal Government is not a party to this Agreement and is not subject to any obligations or liabilities to the non-Federal entity, contractor, or any other party pertaining to any matter resulting from the Agreement.
